

# Bolivia

## Introduction

Bolivia had been on the radar for quite a while, and this year we finally made it to this new country in the Andes. Three weeks was just a bit on the short side to do a complete loop of the birding sites (even with skipping outliers such as Sadiri lodge and Riberalta) but we managed to make a three-week itinerary and even add in an attempt for Horned Curassow in the TIPNIS-reserve. Quite a high-paced and tiring trip, but with excellent birds!

## Itinerary

Day 1	Friday 22 Sept	Flight Amsterdam – Madrid – Santa Cruz
Day 2	Saturday 23 Sept	Santa Cruz (arrival 06.15) – drive (2h) to Refugio Los Volcanes
Day 3	Sunday 24 Sept	Refugio Los Volcanes –drive (4h) to Red-fronted Macaw reserve
Day 4	Monday 25 Sept	Red-fronted Macaw reserve –(2h) drive to Siberia road – night at Tiraque
Day 5	Tuesday 26 Sept	Tiraque – drive (1h) birding and night at Coroni forest (camping)
Day 6	Wednesday 27 Sept	Birding at Coroni forest & lake Coroni area – afternoon & night at Miguelito
Day 7	Thursday 28 Sept	Miguelito – Aqueduct road – night at Cochabamba
Day 8	Friday 29 Sept	Cochabamba – Cerro Tunari – drive to Inquisivi (7h), birding and night at Inquisivi
Day 9	Saturday 30 Sept	Inquisivi (morning car trouble) – (6-7h) drive to Pongo (car camping)

- October is the ideal period to visit when it is springtime in the southern hemisphere and the rainy season has not yet started (starts in November). Our trip was a bit early in hindsight, especially for the Inti Tanager (Maicharapo valley) where the first birds had only just returned on October 4<sup>th</sup>.
- Our itinerary was a big loop across the country containing most the usual birding sites and driving a full circle, without extra internal flights this gave us maximal flexibility. (some tours do the Santa Cruz to La Paz as the main 2-week tour and then the lowland part as an extension).
- For our itinerary we skipped some sites because we had birded NW Argentina before (so no need for Tucuman Parrot, Chaco-species, Altiplano-species), but we haven't been to Southern Peru yet. These two birding sites have most overlap obviously.
- Riberalta (Masked Antpitta) was out of our range for a three-week trip and adds at least two full days of driving or another flight.
- Birding tours fly to Trinidad and/or Riberalta although on an independent trip you end up with the additional hassle of having to arrange transport but saving some long driving days.
- Within our loop we skipped Apa Apa Reserve, it just didn't fit timewise. Apa Apa would give another chance for Scimitar-winged Piha and Cloud-forest Screech owl amongst others (which we both found at Death Road).
- We visited the Maicharapo valley near Apolo for the recently described Inti Tanager. The birds arrive in October in the valley and with our visit on October 4-5 we had one of the earliest dates ever recorded for the species here (and it was clear that only a few birds had returned). To be more on the safe side/ find higher numbers a visit a bit later in October probably helps (in November the rainy season starts).
- The TIPNIS-reserve would have fitted way easier in our itinerary after Miguelito substation but a visit was impossible in September, so we made an additional detour from Santa Cruz at the end of the trip.
- The visit to the TIPNIS-reserve remained uncertain until we were in Apolo, our alternative plan was Sadiri-lodge which seems an excellent site for foothill-species.
- We focussed on the endemics and other targets and did not inflate our trip list by visiting marshes. Even though we tried hard we missed some species, for completeness we mention the species we tried to see but did not see, but do not always mention other good birds at a site.

Main target species we dipped:

- Yungas Antwren – best chances in the Apolo-area.
- Unicolored Thrush – rarely seen in the riverine forest around the Rio Marmore (Trinidad area)
- “Beni Greenlet” – undescribed Greenlet from the Trinidad area

## Other birders

We obviously visited Bolivia during the peak time for visiting birders and we met quite a few during our trip including a small group of birders in the Macaw reserve, a tour at Cerro Tunari, a private tour at Death Road, another private tour at Machariapo Valley and a group of independent Czech birders at the same site.

## Practicalities

### Guiding

We did this trip independently and were only accompanied/guided in the TIPNIS-reserve, see the site description for details. During our trip we met a few private tours ([www.birdboliva.com](http://www.birdboliva.com), Tanager Tours) and international tour companies visit Bolivia as well (e.g. Rockjumper, Birdquest, Wings).

### Literature

We heavily relied on the excellent tripreport by Rob Jansen (2022) and were in whatsapp-contact with him about visiting TIPNIS as he was making his way south through Bolivia during our trip. We brought the Birds of Bolivia book by Herzog et al. but mainly relied on the Merlin app in the field. In addition to the sounds in the Merlin bird package we downloaded a selection through Xeno-canto.org. Other than the report by Jansen there's not too many useful reports around but the recent reports by Rockjumper and Birdquest were somewhat useful as background.

## Travelling

We rented a car with Hertz through Rentalcars.com – we chose for renting through Rentalcars because of the fact that with Hertz directly you get only 100km per day and through Rentalcars we got an additional 1200 km with similar rental costs. Extra kilometers were 0,35 USD per kilometer. In the end we drove around 4500 kilometers in total. We opted for a Toyota Rav4 (or similar) and got a Nissan Qashqai (although I suppose an X-trail would be the corresponding Nissan model). The Qashqai did have enough clearance and was 4x4 which we didn't really need in the dry weather. Throughout our trip the suspension slowly deteriorated from a few extra noises on the first day until an almost undrivable level (on a non-asphalt road) on our final day. Also our radiator fan broke down in Inquisivi causing the car to overheat which we had to get fixed and we had a flat tire (on the perfect asphalt towards Trinidad!) which wasn't repairable. In the end quite an expensive car, but we got where we wanted to go without any major delays.

In contrast to the expensive car, gas is incredibly cheap (for Bolivian plates), all gas stations register your plate and your Carnet (which is a form of local ID, but as long as you give some form of ID with a number they register that). Gas shortages do occur throughout so don't count on getting gasoline at every station. Once we had to detour 30km to get gas – so fill up when you can.

The opening hours of the rental agency differed between the airport and the Santa Cruz city office. We booked the car at the city office (because the site wouldn't let us book at the airport at that time of day) and afterwards sent a message ([santacruz@hertz.com.bo](mailto:santacruz@hertz.com.bo)) if we could get the car at the airport which wasn't a problem for a fee of 35 USD.

Bolivianos have a habit of putting up roadblocks as a protest. During our trip there were roadblocks along our route for several days – but luckily just not when we were there. The government keeps a map of road status including roadblocks at: <https://transitabilidad.abc.gob.bo/mapa>

We got an Entel SIM-card in the arrivals hall of the Viru Viru airport. Being able to make local phone calls and have internet is a very big advantage and we used it almost daily (to check ebird, to make calls and arrangements for the TIPNIS-trip, etc). We bought the SIM including registration (with passport etc.) but somehow the SIM-card stopped working after two weeks. After asking around at a few shops we found out we had to visit an ENTEL-shop to fix it. So we visited an Entel-shop in Trinidad to get it working again; the explanation was that you have to register the SIM, but also the phone (which they didn't do or did not tell us at the airport), but the guy at ENTEL-shop could do it within a minute. Note that all conversations were done in Spanish – having a decent level of Spanish makes it a lot easier to get around in Latin America, especially in the more remote areas.

## Eating & Sleeping

We had booked Refugio Los Volcanes and the Red-fronted Macaw lodge in advance for the first 2 nights of the trip. After that we just showed up and in a few cases booked something through booking.com on the day itself. For a few sites accommodation is scarce or lacking where you see the tour companies making long drives to reach the birding sites. In those cases we opted for (car) camping, which saves quite a few hours of driving in the dark and gives some extra flexibility. In total we slept 6 nights in the car/ tent. We'll try to give relevant details in the site descriptions. Finding food is simple in Bolivia; villages and cities have plenty of small, simple restaurants and also along the busier roads food is often found, including markets that sell bread, fruit etc. Meat with rice/ potatoes is the default (in varying quality) – not our favorite cuisine but quick and convenient while on a high-paced birding trip. For breakfast and lunch in the field we mostly bought some bread and fruit. For the nights in the tent/car we brought a cooking stove plus some easy instant meals from home. For the TIPNIS trekking see details on food on that section.

## Weather

The weather was exceptionally warm (40+ Celsius in the lowlands), probably an effect of El Nino this year. Luckily some sort of front with a bit of rain came through when we were in Trinidad reducing the temperature to the lower 30s for two days – but most of our trip was (very) dry and hot including in the mountains. On the positive side: almost no birding time was lost due to rain.

## Health and safety

As with most trips, the overtaking of trucks on mountainous roads is probably the most dangerous activity. The Chapare region (/Tipnis reserve) is a coca growing area and the Dutch Government warns against travel in this area – since we discussed our visit with Tipnis and were accompanied by locals we felt safe, but it is probably wise not to go exploring on your own in this region.

## Money

ATMs were found in most larger places, but one of the most widespread banks (Banco Union) in the smaller towns only allowed 500 bolivianos per withdrawal, other banks had higher limits (2000 Bolivianos).

## Costs

Tickets (Air Europa Amsterdam-Madrid-Santa Cruz) were 1200 euro pp, car rental including extra kms was 3274 euro. The remainder (gas, hotels, food) costs 2740 in total for 2 people. We lost our deposit on the rental but this was covered by our creditcard-insurance.

## Visited Sites

We took a few GPS points of sites and specific birds, those are available here

We made another google map with GPS-points gathered beforehand, send us an email if you are interested in this file.

## Refugio Los Volcanes

### Logistics

We booked our stay through: <https://www.refugiolosvolcanes.com/> and paid 200 dollar for one night, including all meals. The side road starts (at -18.1351, -63.6310) through a gate – and is a somewhat rough road until a viewpoint (at -18.1196, -63.6088). There you have to park and ring a bell and you will be collected since the access road is too narrow/steep for guests to drive down. The Refugio (-18.1044, -63.5989) is a very beautiful place with excellent food and trails. It was very hot and very windy during our stay which didn't help in the birding.

### Birding

Main reason to visit is the localized Bolivian Recurvebill, which in recent has become more difficult to find (the best place to see them is Sadiri-lodge, which we did not visit in the end). During our 24h stay at the Refugio we mainly focused on the road and the area around the Senda Loro trail (-18.1068, -63.5975), in this area we heard and saw glimpses of a Bolivian Recurvebill (-18.1069, -63.5979). Senda Loro is part circular, the trail that starts closest to the lodge goes along a dry riverbed, then climbs up to a ridge and trails back continues along the ridge and then descends back to the road. Along the ridge we had good views of Military Macaw. White-throated Piping Guans was mostly seen around the clearing. We found Bolivian Tapaculo along the trail (-18.1106, -63.5958), but missed Slaty Gnateater at this site (the latter we later found at Miguelito).

## Red-fronted Macaw Reserve

### Logistics

See: <https://armoniabolivia.org/wildlife-and-bird-watching-ecotourism-holiday-in-bolivia/> The ecolodge costs US\$200 per person per night (it includes breakfast, lunch and dinner and local guide service but still quite steep compared to other eco lodges in South America. However, it is a good way to support the conservation efforts and involvement of local communities). ### Birding

From the lodge-area (-18.13568, -64.8287) you have an excellent view towards the rocks where the Red-Fronted Macaws fly around, on our first afternoon we viewed the birds from the lodge area and the next morning we walked

towards the towering cliff. At the bottom is a fenced area where they place peanuts where the parrots feed on the ground. The area is in the shade (not ideal for photos), and the parrots are quite shy, but when we climbed onto the cliff a little to the east we had very good views of the feeding Macaws including passing birds with perfect light. The reserve has some fenced off viewing points on the top of the cliffs as well (which we didn't visit). In the lodge gardens we had excellent views of Grey-crested Finch and Bolivian Blackbird, Cliff Parakeets are numerous.

Along the main road towards the lodge we made a short stop and walked through the scrub around -18.0969, -64.4999 for Bolivian Earthcreeper (there are several spots along the road with suitable habitat if you look on ebird but already on our first stop we found the bird).

## Siberia road

### *Birding*

Since we had quite a high paced itinerary, we only birded here a few hours (10.00-15.00) in the middle of the day. We parked our car near the start of the track walked the first part the road up and down twice. Best birds were Trilling Tapaculo, Rufous-faced Antpitta (common, but seen at -17.8435, -64.6958). There are quite a few species that can be seen here, but most can be seen at other sites as well so a visit isn't essential. Giant Antshrike was a nice HO bonus that started calling down slope (but given we had seen in previously in Argentina and Brazil we did not try to see it).

## Cochabamba – Chapare road

### *Logistics*

As we came from the south we had decided to sleep in the village Tiraque – as a logical en route place towards Coroni forest the next morning. Tiraque is a very small village and we drove to the main square to find a place to sleep. The hotel from google (-17.4261,-65.7225) turned out to be closed, but by asking around we found a phone number on the door next to the hotel referring to a Residencia. We called, confirmed the stay (very cheap), and 30 min later someone got us the keys for the room. The next morning when we continued to Colomi the gas station had no fuel and pointed us back toward Sacaba across the pass towards Cochabamba. 30km there and back to get fuel was not ideal but at least we had a full tank again after which we continued towards Coroni forest road.

The area north east of Cochabamba along the Chapare road has several birding sites but no logical accommodation available (tours drive from Cochabamba or Villa Tunari). There seems to be cheap accommodation around Colomi and a few Cabanas around Corani lake but we decided to camp the first night at the Coroni forest to be close to the birds. For the second night we wanted to be close to the Miguelito Substation road. We found a hotel on Google (-17.18119, -65.76302). When we arrived the hotel seemed to be no longer in use but when asking we got a room for the night. Camping along the road at Miguelito would have been quite possible as well, especially near the 1500m trail which seemed a good camping spot. Lower down from Miguelito you can drive to Villa Tunari for some lower altitude Yungas birding. This would have been the logical point in the trip to do the TIPNIS-trekking for the Horned Curassow, but since the guide was not available in September, we decided to skip the entire Villa Tunari area at this point and come back at the end of the trip.

### *Birding*

**Coroni forest road:** We arrived late (around 08.30) due to the gasoline run to Cochabamba. We drove up the road and parked here -17.1568, -65.8731 and birded up and down the road for the first bit of the morning. We then drove to the top -17.14856, -65.8646 (where we camped) and walked both forks of the road for a bit, the left fork seems to have the better habitat (less open). After the plateau/camping area there was quite some recently cleared plots and new huts. The slopes along the road up to the plateau seem a bit steep for clearing, so let's hope that part stays forested, but obviously more development was ongoing. We had good weather for the entire day and bird activity was very high throughout the day. Best birds along the road: A group of 4 Chestnut-crested Cotingas at -17.1536, -65.8685, several Light-crowned Spinetails, Black-throated Thistletails, Scaled Metaltails, Gould's Incas, White-browed Conebill in a flock, Orange-browed Hemispingus at -17.1436, -65.8650, several Hooded Mountain Toucans, Swallow-tailed Nightjar at campsite during cooking, Bolivian Antpitta seen well at campsite. The next morning our plan was to spend another half day birding the Coroni forest road but the weather canceled that idea: the morning turned out to be a

mix of rain – mist – rain which started just after we had packed our tent. We felt extra luck with the high bird activity we had had the day before.

**Lake Coroni area:** To escape the rain (which didn't work) we decided to drive out and back up the mountain to the area just north of the lake that we had scouted on ebird. We easily found our target Black-hooded Sunbeam here (and only one of the trip) at -17.2250, -65.9019. Afterwards we drove down, had lunch and went towards Miguelito Substation road, by which time luckily the rain had stopped.

**Miguelito Substation road:** After lunch drove down to the (former) hotel to arrange a room at -17.4261, -65.7225. We then drove the last few km to the substation and parked at the first stop at -17.16985, -65.75733. This stretch of forest is at around 2000m altitude and we birded along the road (Straw-backed Tanager, Yungas Tody-tyrant) and the side trail down (Yungas Warbler, Bolivian Tyrannulet). For the second stop we drove down to the 1500m-area for Upland Antshrike trail (see description in tripreport by Jansen). The Antshrikes were easily found.

Next morning there was a lot of mist. We birded the 2000m area again (finding Slaty Gnateater at -17.1698, -65.7576, several Blue-banded Toucanet and twice a female Rufous-booted Racket-tail along the side-trail). We then drove even lower down to escape the clouds (at -17.14627, -65.77925) where we saw Amazonian Umbrellabird, Cock of the Rock around the bridge and a Scaled Antpitta seen at -17.1443, -65.7809.

Driving back up towards Cochabamba we made a 5-min stop along the highway at -17.2108, -65.8204 and quickly found a Golden-crowned Flycatcher (sometimes finding stakeouts on ebird can be very effective).

**Aqueduct road:** This road is the worst of roads driven in this area, quite stony and washed out. We thought to visit the site for a few hours before driving back to Cochabamba but we quickly found out that the road is too bumpy for a short visit. We decided to walk instead of drive the car and use the time to bird the habitat at the beginning of the road (parked here: -17.2145, -65.8709). We should have checked on the satellite images earlier, since only the first bit of the road turned out to be good habitat, after that the habitat was mostly cleared and a just hot and sunny walk. So the site isn't an ideal stop for 3 hours birding in the afternoon. In the lower part we saw several White-throated Quail-doves and the fly-by Black-winged Parrots (-17.2166, -65.8752) were very welcome surprise.

## Cochabamba - Cerro Tunari

We slept in Cochabamba in some sort of wellness resort hotel (at -17.33599, -66.23075) found through booking.com. Nothing special but a welcoming good shower, easy on-site restaurant and conveniently located near the road to Cerro Tunari.

### Birding

Cerro Tunari offers a very cool high altitude birding spot close to the city. Since we had spent already quite some time in the high Andes in earlier trips we had only 2 targets here: the Cochabamba Mountain Finch, Cochabamba Warbling Finch. We made a first short stop at: -17.28186, -66.31166 where we quickly found the first Cochabamba Mountain finches. When we continued to the next stop it turned out a tour group was already birding there, so we continued to another point further up the road. We parked at -17.27607, -66.32902 and it was very birdy when we exited the car (Giant Conebill, Cochabamba Mountain Finch, Giant Hummingbird, Red-tailed Comet, Yellow-billed Tit-Tyrant, Greenish Yellow Finch etc). After birding along the road on both sides of the bridge, we returned down to the corner at -17.28637, -66.31078 where we found the Bolivian Warbling finch relatively quickly. The morning had started with a burst of activity but in the next hours it quickly became hot and quiet. Having seen all our targets, we continued towards Inquisivi (at 09.15).

## Inquisivi

The only reason to visit the remote Inquisivi is for the localized Bolivian Spinetail. We took the route RN 4 – Konani – Quime (end of asphalt just before town) – Inquisivi. Between Konani and Quime you cross a high pass and descent to Quime (for more detail see directions by Jansen).

Since we arrived with a little time before dark, we tried the Spinetail at the site where Jansen saw it and found it there as well at -16.89639, -67.14109. When we drove back up to Inquisivi at dusk our motor overheated, luckily just before

the hotel (at -16.908098, -67.138364) so we could leave the car there to cool down overnight. We bought some coolant in a shop at the Plaza but there was no Mecanico or Electrico in town to check the car so the next morning we carefully drove back to Quime and got the radiator fan fixed there. In the end this took all morning so we didn't do any birding this morning. In the afternoon we drove to La Paz and just reached our car camping spot at Pongo before dark.

## La Paz area

### Logistics

From La Paz the road climbs up to La Cumbre (pass with a lake) and then goes down into the lowlands. We skipped highest elevation around La Cumbre because when we arrived it was already quite late due to our car trouble in Inquisivi and the pass was completely clouded. We drove down to Pongo (still covered in mist) and after a nice meal of Trucha along the road we drove a bit further to a car campsite described by Jansen (-16.31412, -67.91043). We had hoped to bird Pongo this afternoon, but instead we birded Pongo the next morning from dawn until a few hours later the clouds closed in at Pongo. We then drove down to the Coroico (Death) road, with light rain/mist and tried birding the higher elevations. Because of the weather we continued down rather quickly and birded the road lower down from our campsite at -16.27643, -67.79218 (old quarry). The buildings just above this campsite have slightly confusing signs (campsite, but also private property – keep out). During our stay a private tour with Miguel Lezama was sleeping at this site so apparently it is possible to sleep here? The location is excellent for birding, so if you do not want to be camping along the road this would be an excellent site to try to stay.

### Birding

**Pongo valley:** see Jansen for trail description to Chuquetanga valley. Our targets were Puna Tapaculo (several seen and heard), Scribble-tailed Canastero (-16.3240, -67.9540), Line-fronted canastero (-16.3214, -67.9540). We stopped before the wall as we found the two Canastero's and the clouds closed in (and walking above 4000m is not very easy going).

**Coroico road:** After Pongo we started at the upper part of the road but since it was completely clouded birding was close to impossible. We then drove down to our campsite and birded the road up and down while the weather slowly cleared. There are quite a few tourist mountain bikers that come down the road between 10AM and 2PM – but not too many to detract from birding (also not too many cars). On our first day the afternoon remained clouded with excellent activity, but the next day was clear weather and activity died down lot quicker (this second morning we birded higher up the road). Best birds along the road were Scimitar-winged Piha -16.2743, -67.7915, a pair of Band-tailed Fruiteater at -16.2803, -67.7950, Chestnut-crested Cotinga -16.2738, -67.791, Buff-thighed Puffleg around the campsite, and at night a Cloud-forest Screech owl calling 25m down the road from the campsite (in the end we saw it only in the Thermal scope).

**La Cumbre:** Other trips also bird at La Cumbre but since we had seen all high Andes species already in previous trips, we didn't really bird the around here (other than a short stop).

## Lago Titicaca

This huge high altiplano lake on the border with Peru has one very special bird: the flightless Titicaca Grebe. We first tried the road to the Isla Cojata area at -16.23075, -68.58554 but it was very hot and dusty and the low water levels didn't really give us a reasonable chance for grebes so we drove further to the hotels/restaurant-area that on ebird seems the easiest site to find the grebes. We chose restaurant Pachamama where the restaurant area looks out over the lake so we could combine lunch with birding. The meals were not very special, but the grebes were nice (in total we saw 7 Titicaca Grebes).

## Sorata

Just before the small town of Sorata is the only place to find the endemic Berlepsch's Canastero. See Jansen for more details on the location. We found the Canastero quite quickly in the afternoon in an uninspiring habitat at -15.82203, -68.64247. It is not really necessary to sleep in Sorata, but we drove on and slept in hotel Toro Bravo at -15.77868, -

68.64654. Alternative to sleep is the town of Achacachi along the main road on the altiplano which is definitely less charming to stay for a night.

## **Apolo area**

### *Logistics*

It's a long drive from Sorata to Apolo along a practically empty road. After the village of Escoma the tarmac switches to gravel and goes through a beautiful landscape where you slowly descend into the lowlands. The journey took us all day (11 hours driving, 1 hour birding break). After arriving in Apolo we slept at Hotel Landivar -14.71614, -68.41922. (Some tours sleep at Charazani which gives you the opportunity to bird the Yungas forest in mid-morning hours the next day). After our night at Apolo, we continued the next morning to Maicharapo Valley where we birded the full day, camped there and birded the next morning after which we returned to Apolo for lunch. Afterwards in the afternoon we birded Aten, returned to hotel Landivar and next morning birded Aten again and continued along the road to Caranavi.

### *Birding*

There are three birding sites around Apolo - all 1-2 hrs drive from Apolo: the Yungas before Apolo, Aten (Palkachupa Cotinga, Green-capped Tanager) and Maicharapo valley (Inti Tanager).

**Yungas before Apolo:** We could only bird the Yungas before Apolo for an hour on a hot afternoon, and it's definitely worth more time than that (Yellow-rumped Antwren, Yungas Antwren, Bolivian Recurvebill all possible in the area) but we had very little activity. If you are returning the same way towards La Paz you get another chance to bird this on a morning but since we continued towards Caranavi we missed a chance on the way back.

**Maicharapo Valley:** The recently described Inti ("Kill Bill") Tanager was one of our main targets of this trip. It is about 2 hours drive from Apolo to the Maicharapo valley, with a river crossing in the last part. Looking at the photos in the trip report by Jansen the river was lower (even more so on the way back), but still we were glad we crossed in the daylight (we started driving from Apolo at 05.30). When we arrived at the top of the hill (-14.4388, -68.5326) we met a private tour and heard the first Inti Tanager quite quickly after getting out of the car. Unfortunately we could not see the bird; the sound came from lower in the valley and it is hard to look down plus the light is against you in the morning. We started walking and lower down along the road we heard 2 more birds in the first hour but out of sight. After that it got warm and the birds stopped singing and we hadn't seen anything, very frustrating. We birded the road up and down in the heat until activity was completely dead and it was very hot. A very cool and unexpected moment was a Rufous-vented Ground Cuckoo that suddenly crossed the road!! (at -14.4353, -68.5366). It started bill-snapping out of view and then a second Rufous-vented Ground Cuckoo also started bill-snapping at the opposite side of the road. We had a tense wait and managed to see one of the birds again in the roadside for a couple of seconds. This remote forest sure is full of surprises...

At midday we waited for a few hours in the shade along the road, hoping that the bird activity would pick up again. It stayed very hot and quiet but just before dark we heard an Inti Tanager again just below the top; it came close but he just remained out of sight. We then drove down to the campsite mentioned by Jansen (-14.4094, -68.54256) and when cooking dinner another group of birders (3 Czechs) joined us for camping. What are the odds that of all places in Bolivia you run into birdwatchers here at night?

The next morning we quite easily found the Inti Tanager at the top again; already around 6:20AM we heard the first one and half an hour later one bird came up from the valley, crossed the road and showed very well for about 15 minutes. After the first sun hit the forest it quickly became quiet again. Given that we were very early in October (Oct 4 and 5 might be the earliest records so far?) and birds are just getting back it seemed that activity was a lot lower than later in the season, and early morning was the only moment to see them (not sure if the extremely hot weather this year due to El Niño also played a role). Afterwards we tried the trail (see Jansen, start at -14.39604, -68.54148) for Yungas Antwren but no luck. It was hot and quiet, and the fires we saw the day before were clearly along the trail with quite a few parts still smouldering. The lower parts along the road are obviously being burned at a high rate. We return to Apolo around 10.00AM.



**Aten area:** Aten is a small village south of Apolo and the surrounding habitat is good for two localized targets: Palkachupa Cotinga and Green-capped Tanager. We only birded the Aten area from the main road. The first afternoon we walked along a scrubby area just after the village of Aten and found 2 Palkachupa Cotingas at -14.9361, -68.3262. The second morning we parked our car at -14.9008, -68.3349 and found both Palkachupa Cotinga and Green-capped Tanager in the scrubby area (-14.9033, -68.3366). We continued along the road and found Round-tailed Manakin in an area with a few trees (-14.9139, -68.332). We were told by several locals if we wanted to visit sites (in which they meant side-roads?) we had to get permission and pay a fee. For example, if you visit the area around -14.94247, -68.32279 you have to pay a fee to someone apparently but not very clear how it works and why. We do not have any problem paying for conserving habitat, but paying for access to a public road with no clear efforts for conservations seems strange.

## Trinidad area

### Logistics

We stayed near Laguna Suarez at Hotel Laguna Jardin (-14.87393, -64.86118 and booked through Booking.com). The downside was that the restaurant closed at 17.00 so for most meals we went to a Trinidad where there are plenty of restaurants, it was in a birdy surrounding though which is a plus. Trinidad is a reasonable sized city that has everything you need (in our case it was very handy to visit the Entel store to fix our SIM-card and to buy a new tire since we had a flat tire driving towards Trinidad which was unreparable).

### Birding

We birded several areas around Trinidad, described below. Note that there is plenty of extensions to be made from here. For example, we didn't go to the grassland/cerrado areas to the north for White-winged nightjars (see Jansen).

**Laguna Suarez:** We birded the lake-side for a bit from our hotel but mainly focussed on the scrubby area -14.87327, -64.87586 in the direction of town. We also birded the first bit of the road towards Loreto. This whole area is very birdy, and we were lucky with the weather (both days clouds and lower temperatures compared to the 40+ degrees on the day we arrived). We tried but dipped on the 'Beni Greenlet' which is sometimes seen in this area.

**Loreto (Blue-throated Macaw):** Initially we wanted to bird the Laney Rickman reserve (<https://conservationbirding.org/?reserve=laney-rickman-reserve>) but after getting in contact with Armonia through WhatsApp they told us that day visits are no longer possible. Instead we decided to drive to the village of Loreto where the Blue-throated Macaws are possible to see as well. Because of some issues with our SIM we weren't able to contact the guy mentioned by Jansen (and later in Loreto we tried to call him through our Dutch SIM but then he did not pick up). So in the end we just drove to Loreto and tried our luck. There were a couple of people around at the town plaza but they didn't really know anyone who could help us with the Macaws. We then drove in the direction where Rob Jansen had seen the macaws and waited along the access road to a private farm – we stopped where the public road ended and scanned from there (-15.2053, -64.7596). After checking quite a few Blue-and-Yellow Macaws a group of 3 Blue-throated Macaws flew by and perched in full view. Success!

**Puerto Ballivan river trail:** We birded here for one morning (start of trail at -14.7954,-64.9734) Luckily it was a somewhat clouded morning, but bird-wise a slow start as well. We slowly birded along the trail back-and-forth. Most important targets for us were Plain Softtail, Bolivian Slaty Antshrike, Sulphur-bellied Tyrant-Manakin and Fawn-breasted Wren. Unicolored Thrush is a very rare bird that is sometimes seen here, why it is so rarely seen we don't know... but we only saw Creamy-bellied and Hauxwell's Thrushes here. On the late afternoon the next day we visited a lagoon close to Puerto Ballivan at -14.7723,-64.9637: our main target was Band-tailed Nighthawk of which we saw several flying around at dusk, another bonus here was Sunbittern.

**River crossing:** When driving towards Trinidad from Caranavi we crossed the river with one of the ferries. Oronoco Goose is sometimes seen here, but we did not see any. The next day we checked again (from -14.8758, -65.0345) by scanning the shores but again no luck.

## TIPNIS - Sejezsama (Horned Curassow)

### *Logistics - preparations*

After seeing recent eBird-sightings (Oct 2022) of Horned Curassow we contacted Tjalle Boorsma of Armonia to explore if we could organize a visit to the area. Tjalle responded positively but warned us that this is a restricted area (it is part of a National Park but also a region that is known for its coca growing) so to access there's a few parties involved: mainly the local indigenous community and TIPNIS-management. After a few messages back and forth before the trip we had heard that a visit in September was not possible due to other activities of the local guide. We were already traveling through Bolivia at this point and we were in Apolo when we finally got the good news that a visit was possible in October and got the contact details of the local guide Antonio (who lives in the village Sejezsama close to the forest) and the contact details for TIPNIS (based in Villa Tunari). From both sides we agreed that this would be a good experiment to be the first paying tourists to visit the area, with an ambition of both Armonia and the community to set something up towards the future. The total price we paid was 2600B, consisting of a 1100B fee for community and 250B for guiding/porters per person per day. Antonio insisted on taking 2 extra porters with him but in hindsight the 3<sup>rd</sup> guide/porter was not really needed.

In the next few days we called Antonio several times to discuss the details of the trip with him. Parallel we also got in contact with TIPNIS for getting a permit. It took quite a few messages and calls, but in the end we were able to collect a permit in Villa Tunari.

For other birders who would like to visit in the future, it is probably best to first contact Armonia ([reservations@armonia-bo.org](mailto:reservations@armonia-bo.org)) and let them help in arranging.

### *Logistics – during the trip*

We had planned the trip for 2 nights in the area (first day arriving from Villa Tunari, then 2 full days to search for the Curassow and the last day to get back to either Villa Tunari or drive further towards Santa Cruz, depending on the time (we had to fly out the next morning). This was all we could fit in the itinerary given that it was arranged a bit last minute. In hindsight 2 nights is the minimum, and an extra day up in the forest would give more time/ increase the chance to find the Curassow.

We started the first day at 10AM at Villa Tunari where we had arranged to meet the park ranger from TIPNIS (Felix) who gave us the permit and who then joined us in the car towards Secejsamma to help at the check points (It turned out we never had to show the permit to anyone and there was only one checkpoint). It is a 1,5 hr drive on mostly tarmac road (and a river crossing because a bridge was damaged) to Sejezsama where we met Antonio. We had lunch together and then drove another 5 minutes to Antonio's house (at -16.6210,-65.7601). The rest of the afternoon was spent waiting at his house. Although we discussed we wanted to try to get to the right area that same day to have more chance for the Curassow, we had to wait for the rest of the porter crew who were still at work. This meant we would go only to the edge of the forest and camp the first night at his shed ("lower camp", gps -16.6477,-65.7862). So at the end of the afternoon we were taken up the hill on the back of a motorbike and we put up our tent next to his shed. Antonio left again in the evening and came back with 2 more porters later at night.

The next morning we started walking at 6AM. It is a 2-hour walk to base camp; the first part is flat, then you need to cross the river twice and then the climbing starts towards the base camp. On the way back we took a different route that is a bit longer but skips the river crossings (the water was knee-high, and we had to take off our boots to cross). When we arrived at base camp we put up our tents, the porters arranged water etc (we brought our own waterfilter). Around 10AM we started birding and came back at dusk. In advance we were told to bring all the food (for 4people/ 2 nights), but an extra guy joined us and they arranged some food as well. We then shared everything (rice, pasta, canned fish, hot sauce and some instant meals from The Netherlands) and that worked out very well. The last morning we did some final birding and then birded/ walked back out. Around 12AM we were at the shed again, after a short rest we then went back to the village on the back of the motorbike again (this time we took another route which was easier for the motorbikes (flatter) but did involve crossing the river twice). Around 2PM we said goodbye and drove off in our car.

## Birding

After putting up our tents at base camp we continued to the area where they saw the Curassow last year. Just after camp we heard the first Curassow calling deep in the valley for a few times which gave good hope (-16.6688, -65.7919), but we didn't hear or see anything for the rest of the day. The trail had to be cleared with a machete for the most part which meant lots of hacking (which doesn't help birding – we saw or heard very few birds during our visit). When we reached that spot where Tjalle et al had seen the Pauxi 12 months before (-16.6761,-65.7870) it was clearly good habitat: not very steep with big trees and therefore bit more view into the understory, but unfortunately no signs of Curassows. For the last few hours of the afternoon we descended through an arroyo where the boulders and the jumps kept increasing, mossy stones kept getting more slippery and the legs started hurting more. Not our best afternoon of the trip – and most important – not giving much hope for seeing or hearing any curassows. Based on Antonio's story it felt that the sighting of last year was a bit of a lucky shot where they had not heard the birds calling but had checked this area (based on earlier camera trap sighting) and stumbled upon 2 Pauxis that were feeding on the ground. After we had checked the same spot again but this time without luck there wasn't really an idea/plan...

Next morning we suggested to first return to the site where we heard the bird the day before close to the camp since that was the only sign of the birds we had gotten so far. But no call this morning (it wouldn't have helped a lot anyways because it was incredibly steep in any direction). After breakfast we packed our tents and started walking the way back to the edge of the forest. But we didn't go far before we heard a Curassow calling/singing. This time it was closer and more constant. Antonio knew how to get closer which meant we had to return quite a bit and go down another ridge to get closer. We got very close but in the final part we flushed the bird before we could see it (gone over the ridge at -16.6641, -65.7950). The forest floor was super dry with many noisy leaf litter which made sneaking up onto the bird very difficult. Later on we heard another bird (further away in another direction). We were in the same area at around the same time as the day before when we were walking up but then we didn't hear anything.

In the end we left the place feeling a bit disappointed. Although we had come close and managed to get good recordings and observations of the sound, seeing this dinosaur was obviously the goal. Upfront it had been hard to know what to expect and maybe we had thought it would be easier given the fact that Armonia and the community want to set this up as a birder/tourist destination (thereby maybe given the idea that the birds are doable). At the end of the trip we encouraged Antonio to visit the forest more often, clear the trails upfront and try to get a better understanding of the behavior of the birds (ridges where they like to sing, maybe fruiting trees etc). The birds are clearly in the area (last morning we heard at least 3 individuals) but it is no easy game (at least at this point) but who knows what is possible in the future with a bit of effort from the local community.

For other birders that want to try:

- Antonio mentioned that August and September are being better for calling activity. From our visit it is clear that if the birds are not calling, it will be very difficult to find any.
- The trail beyond the base camp is tough going, with most of the time very steep slopes on both sides and dense vegetation. Even if you hear a bird along this stretch (we had a very far call on the first day) chances are high it will be in an unreachable place.
- The part of the forest where we came close to a bird on the second morning (and heard 2 more birds calling) is still steep but better doable to move around plus it has a more open forest floor where you have a better chance of looking into the canopy and on the forest floor.
- Probably due to hunting the birds are very wary. Noisy leaf litter will always be a challenge to sneak up to a bird, with the risk of flushing the bird before getting a good/ any look.
- Walking through the arroyo (with steep stony slopes on both sides) was difficult but also not a good strategy in our view to find a Curassow. Being low down + the noise of machetes/ running water made it almost impossible to hear a calling bird. And to find a foraging bird on the ground we doubt if they would prefer the steep arroyo bottom versus the forest floor.
- Overall, if you like a bit of adventure, like to support the start of local eco-tourism and ideally if you have some more days to explore, this is a very cool destination that not many birders have come to.
